### Principal's Message

Aloha mai Kamaile 'ohana,

Kamaile Academy wants to mahalo all 'ohana and haumāna for their continuous support this school year. School improvement and student success take all of us working together and we are thankful for the continued partnership. We also wish all of our 'ohana a safe and happy holiday season.

Over the next few weeks, all haumāna will be taking the i-Ready middle-of-the-year diagnostic assessment. This assessment shows individuals' growth in the areas of literacy and mathematics. This information helps us to develop and implement interventions for haumāna to support that academic growth. Please talk with your child about the assessment and ensure they get plenty of rest the night before the assessment.

We also need your help with attendance - attending school every day is one of the most important factors in a student's academic success. Currently, Kamaile's average daily attendance is at 84%; as a school, we are shooting for 90% overall attendance. To celebrate haumāna attending school, we have been selecting them at random to come and choose attendance prizes at the end of each day, simply for being here. We love to see all of our haumāna at school, and we want to celebrate them for showing up and working hard. To help your keiki be selected to win a random attendance prize, please send them to school every day! We love perfect attendance!

We ask that all haumāna prioritize reading as part of their daily routine, and make reading fun by reading texts they find interesting. If you do not have reading materials at home, please reach out to your child's teacher so that we can be sure to send reading resources home. Please join us to celebrate our love of reading at our Winter Literacy Fest on December 8th, where we will pass out books to all our Kamaile haumāna. With our support, all haumāna can reach their goal of reading one million words by the end of the school year!
